Training

At the January full training meeting the following key points came out, full notes on SCM (you need to login):

- a) The aim of Tuesday nights is to support newcomers to improve and develop, and provide a less serious and shorter race format for more experienced sailors. On Tuesdays on-water coaching is encouraged with experienced sailors and coaches helping the less experienced both before and after racing. Afterwards food should be available and the bar should be open.
- b) All club boats are seen as a club resource, some however do require specialist knowledge, so booking is required.
- c) We hope to run a RYA Race Coach course. You don't need to be an instructor, but you do need enthusiasm, be an experienced racer and wish to help others learn to race or improve. Contact <u>training</u>, as soon as possible, to express an interest. There are pre-requisites which can generally be done at the club.
- d) A Powerboat Instructor course will run in April. If you are interested contact Adrian Jones to see if there are any spaces.
- e) All training sections Youth Racing Squad (YRS), Royal Yachting Association (RYA) Centre, Sailability are looking for volunteers
- f) First Aid looking to the future we need some more instructors (medical qualifications normally required) please contact <u>Viv</u> <u>Weston</u>.
