Duty Secretary's update: With the Covid situation continuing to ease we are starting to transition to normal duty booking practice. So

- as a reminder, to be able to run a full sailing programme we need each member to complete at least three duties in the course of the season
- the duty roster is now open to volunteers through the summer and will shortly extend to the end of the year
- we will very soon have to start allocating duties for duty dates after the end of June to get the roster filled; so ahead of that please do volunteer without delay so that you can pick the dates that suit you best
- in the meantime, the roster for June has plenty of gaps; as we said previously, we need everyone who has been sailing in the current series to complete one or preferably two or three duties before the end of June in order to make the numbers work; we have been very close to cancelling racing for lack of volunteers in recent weeks
