**Duties:** The Sailing Committee and Covid group will be looking into duties, at present we think the first few weeks will be like last year, once there is some normality the duties will revert back to the normal system.

## **Training**

It is looking increasingly likely that the early June courses can go ahead (Junior and Adult start, along with other junior levels) at present the half term week 1-4th June is pencilled in, with a second course in weekends in June (12/13/26 and 3 July), the dates are on SCM. We are awaiting full RYA guidance, which will hopefully clarify what is permitted, and actions to ensure we are Covid safe.

It will be useful to gauge numbers but we don't want to take payment till nearer the time. Forms will be available soon on the website so please fill one in with course (and course) start date on, so the Training Secretary can keep a list of people and numbers (there will be limits on numbers). Assuming we can run them we will ask for money about 3 weeks before the start.

Meanwhile we hope to complete the instructor and other courses started in 2020 before that date, the people concerned will be contacted direct once we can get dates from the trainer.

We are also looking into windsurfing courses, probably in June when the water is warmer.
