

**Foreshore and grounds:** please remember to put rubbish in bins, rather than pollute the water and shore. This includes bits of rope, tape and the like, thank you.

**Changing rooms:** The changing rooms are available, but please open doors and windows open for ventilation, be considerate and maintain social distance and do not leave sailing gear and bags on the changing benches. There are racks provided or, ideally, store your gear in your vehicle while out on the water.

**Clubhouse Ventilation:** Whilst the clubhouse is open and being used please bear in mind ventilation is a key method of reducing Covid transmission indoors. Windows and doors should be opened, we recognise that it will be colder, so bring appropriate clothing – thank you. Remember to secure the clubhouse if you are last out.
