Racing – from Sailing Sec

- 1. **Race entries:** Please ensure you sign on using the entry amendment sheet if your crew, rig or sail number details are different from the ones you entered online for the series. Please can Race Officer's ensure the signing on sheet is available on the whiteboard under the club house.
- 2. **Duplicate Sail numbers:** Boats are being sailed in races using sail numbers which duplicate one another. The club sailing instructions are now amended to prohibit this practice since it is impossible for scorers to distinguish those boats. If duplicate numbers are used neither boat's results will be recorded for the race series.
- 3. Race result queries: Queries regarding race results should be addressed to the Race Officer on the day (in a polite manner) or subsequently to the Results secretary via email (results@ncsc.org.uk). Any unresolved disputes regarding the results should be resolved using the protest procedure. Note that the Race Officer is empowered to discard the result of any competing boat which is clearly observed not to have completed the course correctly.

**Reminder:** RS 400 Open 4/5th Sept, there is often casual sailing available by early afternoon on Sunday (when racing finished).

**Clubhouse Ventilation**: The clubhouse is open but please bear in mind ventilation is a key method of reducing Covid transmission indoors. Please open windows, doors etc. It will be colder, so bring appropriate cold weather clothing – thankyou. Please also remember to secure the clubhouse if you are last out.

**Dinghy Instructor Course**: Lincoln and District Sailing Association are running a DI course on the following dates: Part 1 – Singlehanded Instructor, 9 October 2021 Pre-entry assessment, 10 October 2021 Singlehanded Instructor course: Day 1, 23 October. Day 2, 24 October, Day 3 + Moderation. **Part 2 – Double handed Instructor**, 30 October, Day 1, 31 October, Day 2 - Cost £250 and bookings can be made at <u>https://www.ticketsource.co.uk/ldsa/t-xgjvgk</u>, club members who have shown commitment by helping on courses as Als etc should contact the training secretary / principle, if they think they could be eligible for a club subsidy.

**Training:** We are very short of instructors for the September course, and are in danger of cancelling and refunding the money, please contact <u>training@ncsc.org.uk</u> if you can help (or respond to email already sent). There are a couple of spaces in the Oppie and adult groups of the September course starting on September 11th. The October course, 18th - 21st, is going ahead and has some spaces, due to potential cold there will be no oppies. A Stage 3 course may be possible if numbers are sufficient, all junior participants will need good wetsuits or drysuits along with warm clothing or over jackets (Average max temp 10'C) - numbers correct as at 1/9/21

The next club powerboat course is Sunday 26th September. Please email <u>training@ncsc.org.uk</u> for more details and an application form for all these courses.

**Duty Secretary:** Can you help as an Assistant Race Officer on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> or Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> September? The ARO role is within the capability of anyone who has done some racing and you have the reassurance of knowing that there is an experienced Race Officer on the boat with you.
