Get behind the wheel – There are plenty of free club safety boat courses coming up for members, you can sign on here. We encourage all water users, racers, casual sailors and SUP users to train up. The course is 1 day of familiarisation and a day of rescue (boats, boards etc). If you need some practice before your duty please contact ryapowerboat@ncsc.org.uk

Wingboards: You may have seen that wingboards are being used on the water by some members. Please note that these new water craft are NOT permitted to be used when racing is taking place. In addition windsurfers and cruising craft including SUPs must keep well clear on the racecourse whether you are experienced or not. If you do want to go out on a race day be ready to launch when racing finishes and use the time in between races, you get the lake to yourself with the added bonus of safety cover.

August Bank Holiday Mon 29th Aug - NCSC Games We plan to run a fun race series involving both dinghies and SUPs together with various land based games the results of which will be added up to give an overall Games Champion. Entries will be taken on the day, with donations to the David Stevens Memorial fund that supports Sailability. Bar – I am sure that, like us, you would like to see the bar open on a regular basis. However this does mean that we need volunteers to do this. It is very easy to learn what is required to run the bar and we can organise keys for locking up etc. Some firm commitments from willing volunteers would enable this to happen.

Swimming – Please note that swimming is **not** permitted on either our main lake or small lake, except through Love Open Water where there are lifeguarded open water swimming sessions organised at designated times. This is not only a club rule but part of our lease. Please do not abuse this – thank you.

Tailgating and security: Please remember that the last person leaving the club (even if you don't think you are) should check that the clubhouse and outbuildings are locked and the gates are shut. All legitimate users have keys. Please also be aware that the visitors code is to be changed 9th Aug and will be posted on the members area of website. This should only be given to legitimate users and please do not allow tailgating. We have recently had people trespassing in the club grounds having accessed either via tailgating (we think) or being given the keypad code. You must also never give out the members code it is private for members only and all legitimate members have the code.
