This month we are looking to celebrate success. Early in June we hosted the **Topper Midlands Champs**. Around 20 Topper sailors enjoyed a competitive two days with a mix of courses to test the sailors' skills. Jessica Powell from Draycote put in a cracking performance with our own Chloe Grayton flying the flag for NCSC and coming a well-deserved 4th place.

ILCA Super Sunday – is a global event which aims to get as many ILCA sailors out on the water. At Notts County it was great to see 24 ILCA sailors enjoying ideal weather conditions for the event. Rooster prizes were awarded to Charlie Hopkinson – ILCA 6 sailor of the day. Sammy Mason – ILCA 4 sailor of the day. Prizes were also given to Irene Grovenstein and John Ainsley for endurance.

Finally, there has been evidence of swimmers itch in the small lake with a number of the open water swimmers being affected. Details of what this is and why it occurs can be <u>found here</u>. Although unpleasant, causing itching, small reddish pimples or blisters shortly after swimming in contaminated water, it is not regarded as dangerous. So far it doesn't appear to be a problem in the large lake but anyone finding themselves wet, after capsizing ,is advised to shower and towel dry as soon as possible.

A further reminder that there is a **NO SWIMMING rule at the club** (except through the organised <u>Love Open Water</u> <u>group</u> which is RLSS lifeguarded) – please ensure that you all abide by this club rule and set an example.

Regatta : Full details of the popular NCSC Club Regatta on 15/16th July are <u>here</u> there will be racing for everyone with both the Commodore's Cup and a Novice Race on each day. Race entry for members is free (make sure you are logged in) but you must enter the Commodore's Cup online before 22:00 on 13th July. There is no free entry on the day. Camping is permitted. There is a social (Pig Roast) with live music on Saturday to which everyone is welcome <u>tickets are here</u>. Reminder to Powerboat drivers: As a driver, it is your responsibility to ensure you mitigate any risks with your powerboat driving practice, including the following points sent by the RYA recently:

- 1. Do not stand to the side or in front of the console while underway.
- 2. Do not film while driving.
- 3. Do not leave the engine running when you are not attached to the kill cord.
- 4. Do not drive at speed through fleets of boats.
- 5. Always keep one hand on the throttle and one hand on the wheel or tiller while underway.

For any club member who would like a refresher / confidence booster before their duty please contact <u>ryapowerboat@ncsc.org.uk</u> and we will do our best to fit you in. Please also note **you must wear appropriate clothing** – this includes buoyancy aids and closed toe shoes / boots.

JMST Topper: We have a race ready Topper available to an aspiring club member. This is provided as part of John Merricks Trust/ RYA award to a member. The Topper will revert to the club in September 23. Details for applying to be allocated this Topper are available <u>here</u>.

Racing rules. The racing rules are key to everyone's enjoyment of the sport. Whichever day we sail, we should all be familiar with and observe the right of way rules. This is the only way racing can take place fairly for all. We recommend beginners buy one of the many books and discuss anything you don't understand with one of the more experienced sailors. Whilst the <u>World Sailing rulebook</u> contains 180 pages, the key section relating to 'when boats meet' (part 2) is only 6 pages or 14 rules, these are the ones everyone should be familiar with.

Reminder: Only Gas BBQ are allowed at club. There is a club one available for members to use (please ask for access).

Sailability: Thanks to all who made the <u>Bleasby school visit another</u> memorable success. We have 'Thank you' letters from the children again; 'We all can't stop talking about how much fun it was.' We are hoping to arrange a Taster visit for Portland College during July.
