Please be aware that a) swimming in either lake is NOT permitted, except through the organised Love Open Water sessions. b) Only Gas BBQs can be used at the club NO charcoal or disposable BBQs please. c) Please do not park cars or boat trailers on the disabled parking areas - access is required at all times.

It has been agreed that there is likely be a need for some members involved with running our activities to undertake the online RYA Safe and Fun safeguarding course, which will be paid for by the Club. As such our safeguarding policy will be updated accordingly. The individuals concerned will be contacted in the near future. We would ask you to cooperate with this requirement in undertaking this worthwhile and informative course.

As many of you know club sailors will be taking part in the International Laser Class Association (ILCA)Super Sunday later this month which will be part of club racing. This is a great opportunity for all of you to wipe those cobwebs off your laser and get out on the water.

She would like to gain feedback from members so everyone is welcome to attend, whether you are seasoned sailors or just starting out.

Parental supervision - Reminder under 18s parents/guardians must be at the Club accompanying and supervising children / youths under 18. We would advise only being down when there is someone who can get a safety boat out or when safety cover is on duty. See club rules and constitution.

Swimming is not permitted on either lake except as part of the Love Open Water organised sessions who have a trained lifeguard on duty when there is swimming. NCSC Members get a discount to Love Open Water.

The club encourages fiercely competitive racing, but at the same time, we need to encourage those new to the sport and the less experienced juniors to join in. **The RYA Racing Charter** provides a framework within which these two objectives can be achieved together. There are four principals enshrined with the charter, Fair Racing, Respect, Fair Resolution and Accountability. Here is a link to the <u>Racing Charter</u> - please take a moment to read it.

ILCA super Sunday 25 June we want to see as many lasers as possible out of the boat park and taking part in racing. This is a country wide initiative, let's hope we can get a great Notts County turnout. Don't forget the training day this Saturday 3 June – still places contact laser@ncsc.org.uk.

Berths: POLITE REMINDER - All berth holders please ensure that you either use the club provided mower (under the club house) or bring garden equipment to keep on top of your allocated berth. At this time of year the weather has been kind to all the weeds, brambles etc covering many berths and boats. It is the berth holders responsibility to maintain their berths and not encroach on neighbours. Please work collectively to tidy the boat park up. Thank you

If any yacht owners have an old out-of-date **Cat C first aid kit** that they could donate to the club for First Aid training that would be most appreciated.

Signing on: Please write neatly and legibly your name and sail number on the signing on sheet. All boats should have a number on their sail, so that race officer, clerk and scorer can record times/finishing positions accurately. Without this, you may not get a result.

Many of the windsurfers were away abroad or elsewhere at Awards evening, so the windsurfers are having a picnic and unofficial **Awards evening on 7 June at around 6pm**. Any one is welcome especially those that SUP.
