- Slow Handicap flag changed to Numeral Pennant 2 when there is a Fast handicap start (Black & White, Oakleaf and Thursday evening races).
- Permitting Junior races to count for scoring with only 1 starter.
- Permitting coaching on Tuesdays and Saturdays.
- Allowing competitors to continue racing after assistance to recover from capsize.
