AGM: The Agenda and nominations, including proposals, were emailed out to all members registered email address on Sunday 29 Oct, if you haven't received it check your spam folder and allow NCSC emails, so it doesn't go into spam in future. The <u>AGM papers</u> and <u>online voting</u> is visible to those eligible to vote, but please only use this if you can't make the AGM. The AGM takes place on 12 Nov (Sunday) at 4pm at the clubhouse. Online voting will run from 1 to 10 Nov.

RYA First Aid courses 4 and 11 Nov. Instructors, you have been sent an email, please book one of these courses now. All members are welcome to take this one-day course aimed at sailing. Cost to club members for the book and certificate (£10), non-members £50.

Please register interest for 2024 courses as soon as possible, no need to pay, just yet. This allows us to assess demand and puts you on the waiting list, we will then contact you with dates etc. <u>Link to booking page</u>, registering interest is under each heading. (PS ignore the date)

Awards evening: There is a questionnaire linked on the front page of the website and <u>here</u>. We would like to know what people want from the awards evening and when they would like it – please fill it in – it takes about a minute and will help steer next year's event. Thank you.

New barrier: We've had to replace the new barrier and add additional sensors following an incident which damaged it soon after it was fitted. We would ask all members to be more careful and if they do find they have caused an issue with the barrier please notify a flag officer immediately so that the damage can be rectified. Even if the barrier is up (green), **stop**, **type in the access code** and proceed. Do not tailgate. Every time the code is entered it resets the timer so it will be safe to pass. Keep your speed at 10mph – any faster and the barrier can't react.

Boat Park : In November, the Boat Park Managers will be undertaking a re-numbering and rearranging of some of the berths in the Topper area of the park, particularly adjacent to the car park. If your berth has changed number, you will be notified of this in an email as soon as the task is completed. To aid Boat Park Maintenance and to assist members, boats in berths that have not been maintained throughout the year may be moved to another berth within the Topper area.
