Commodore's Briefing March 24

First of all a big thank you to Neil and the rest of the team standing in for me whilst I was travelling in January and February. I extend the thank you to everyone who helped clear up after the flooding. We will have to think about how to mitigate the effects of the flooding as the climate changes and it becomes more frequent.

For most of us, the start of the sailing season has arrived. It's a kind of New Year following on from the Gregorian and Chinese New Years. As such we can reflect on resolutions we might make. One thing which has troubled me over the last couple of years are the incidents on the water which spill over into lasting acrimony ashore. Sailing is only a game and a leisure pastime for us all and we sail with a group of people we consider friends. If there is an incident then the best way to resolve it is via a protest, arbitration or an advisory hearing. An impartial individual or committee will help identify the rights and wrongs and then we should shake hands and move on. If there is damage, then each party is obligated to be as helpful as possible to the other. We have recently changed the club rules requiring members to share insurance details with any other party involved if there is likely to be a claim. The insurers will then sort everything out.

I want to pick up and emphasise two events in March Last year we held a rules evening run by the East Midlands Regional Rules Advisor. This concentrated on some of the more esoteric aspects of the rules. This year the evening (14th March) will be hosted by our very own Stephanie Gunn. It is aimed to help those new to the sport who may find the rules a little daunting. We all have an obligation to have an understanding of the rules and to observe them. This is the only way to compete fairly. For me there are no exceptions, either for beginners or for the experienced who think that with a bit of bravado they can get away with it.

A week later (21st March) we have an evening for Race Officers, whether you are an experienced 'Sunday' race officer or someone just beginning as an assistant on Tuesday, there will be something for everyone to take away from this. After rule observance by competitors, effective race management is the thing that makes an event enjoyable. We will cover everything including line setting, courses and recording. Please come along if you can – even if you have been doing it for years!
