### Commodore

Reading through the draft newsletter there are a few points that revolve around common courtesy between members.

The Sailing Committee has agreed to allow Wingsurfers and foiling boards to use the lake whilst racing takes place. This will only work if all parties show respect for one another. All cruising craft should keep clear of those racing, this is how they should show courtesy. Equally, there is no hard definition, for now, of what this means in practice. Racing craft should show courtesy to the cruisers if they happen to meet them during the race.

We should show courtesy and respect to Debs our caterer. She is not paid a retainer by the club. Her remuneration, her reward for the time spent, is entirely the profit she makes on selling the food. It is not courteous to her to buy a child ticket for food and then pile on the plate as much (or more) than an adult would eat. From now on the cheaper ticket means a small portion. There is no problem buying an adult/large portion ticket for a hungry teenage child.

Debs is not paid by anyone to generally tidy up after people or wash crockery for people who have not purchased her food. Members are free to use the clubs crockery for their own food but they must wash up themselves and if you make a mess – tidy it up.

We have had a couple of cases this week of duty crew members just not turning up. This potentially puts the activities of the whole club at risk of not taking place on that day. We understand that there can be unforeseen problems, but please make contact as soon as you can so that alternative people can be found.

On a brighter note ! Plans are in place for the regatta. Debs has planned some really nice food for Saturday Evening. I look forward to seeing many of you at the club that weekend, both at the club and at our social event.

#### Notices - SCM is Sailing Club Manager

**Rule 7** is changed: Members under 18 years of age must be supervised by a parent or other adult in loco parentis when at the club. The responsible adult must be on site at the club and is responsible for ensuring appropriate safety cover is available.

**Rule 19**, the prohibition of wingsurfers and foiling boards on the water whilst racing is taking place is now deleted.

**Rule 20** Cruising During Racing. The first sentence is amended to state that: During club racing cruising craft should keep clear of racing craft and the start finish areas The Exec and the Sailing Committee recommend that:

- Wingsurfers and windsurfers should be aware of the course area
- Racing craft should be aware that wingsurfers and windsurfers might be on the water
- Wingsurfers may be difficult to spot

The requirement for cruising craft of any kind, dinghies, windsurfers or wingsurfers to keep clear of racing craft is an obligation not a request. Cruising craft should, as far as is possible, be aware of the course being sailed by the racers. The first leg of the course will always extend directly upwind from the Committee boat. If in any doubt you can ask the Race Officer before he/she goes afloat or radio from the race office. The Race Officer may not reply immediately if he/she is starting or finishing a race. It is never possible to give more than a rough idea of the possible course before going afloat. The club rules can be found here.

**The Club Regatta is on 5/6th July:** The theme this year is Treasure Island and Castaways. This is an event for all members, with racing for all levels. There will be food and disco on the Saturday evening. Camping is permitted all weekend (see dates on club website). <u>An entry form (free for members) and social ticket booking are here</u>. Visitors are welcome. Come and set up your camping on Friday, the club gas BBQ will be available and the bar will be open. More details of the weekend <u>here</u>. The last day to buy Social tickets is 3rd July. The last day for Race entry is 4th July (no race entry on the day)
